In our population, sadly, Diabetes exists to a degree described as epidemic.



New research confirms that the number of people with vision impairment has increased significantly, right alongside the Diabetes epidemic.

Confirming that vision issues exist through a quick, non-invasive **Vision Screening, can serve as a critical first alert leading us to take the important step to see an eye care professional to have a comprehensive eye examination.**

With a full examination we learn, among many other things, if Diabetes is a contributing factor. Other chronic diseases may also be detected.

Lions KidSight Program

Five percent of all preschool children have vision problems, many of which go undetected. Children with poor vision may not complain, and many will have no noticeable symptoms. Yet vision problems, such as lazy eye, can lead to permanent loss of vision, and even blindness. Vision develops so rapidly that screening for problems early is our best defense against a blinding vision problem. The most important time to test for and correct lazy eye (Amblyopia) is in the preschool years when treatment is most effective - the earlier, the better.

Our KidSight Vision Screening is accomplished by trained and State certified volunteer Lions utilizing a small hand-held camera system called "SPOT" by Welch Allyn that collects images of the structure of the eye and indicates potential abnormalities. "SPOT" is a breakthrough device that quickly and easily detects vision issues. "SPOT" helps ensure that children have an opportunity to reach their full potential ***In just a few seconds, this non-invasive method quickly detects the following vision issues:*** Near or Far sightedness

Unequal refractive power

Blurred vision

Eye structure problem

Pupil size

Eye misalignment



Vision Screening events conducted by **District 2-A2 Lions** through the resources provided by the **Lions Sight Research Foundation** are free-to-the- public services which give community members that take advantage of them, **greater awareness of the need for comprehensive eye examinations.**

Comprehensive eye exams tell us much about our vision and much about our overall health.

Significant numbers of adults screened on our **MOBILE EYE SCREENING UNIT** - (57% for acuity issues / 8.4% for visual field or inter-ocular eye pressure) are recommended to have follow-up examinations by eye care professionals and, **in some cases, have been the first indication that serious vision problems such as glaucoma, cataracts, macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy and other chronic health issues may be developing.**

Since the Vision Screening Program began in 1996, many of the **70,000** individuals that have been screened continually report that, **if they can recall having a comprehensive eye examination, it had been at least five to seven years prior. Strikingly, only a small percentage of those that know that they have Diabetes, have annual examinations done by eye care professionals.**
